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Course Description:

Agueda Johnston Middle School 8th Grade students will take a course in US History which is a year-long course analyzing the origins of the American nation, with a specific concentration on the formation of government and founding documents through the end of the Civil War. Students will focus on geography skills, principles of government, economics, global awareness, cultural diversity and the "Play By the Rules" program from the Guam Judiciary.

At the conclusion of the course students will have a firm grasp and understanding of the details of early American history, allowing them both the historical perspective to comment on particulars as well as form their own unique opinion regarding current issues, preparing them for the study of Reconstruction through the modern era at the High School level, and for active citizenship.

Homework: There will be a Social Studies homework assignment every night. It will usually be small and should take only 15 minutes. Homework is due at the start of each class period.

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Ongoing assignments: In Social Studies, students will have 2 regularly assigned projects:

Current Events- Students should keep up with the news. Students must select, read, reflect on, and present 1 current event per quarter. In order to get credit, students must turn in a reflection (email or written) including the full citation for their source, 1 paragraph summarizing their event and 1 paragraph reflecting on the importance of the event. They must then present the event to the class.

Regional Maps- Students should know geography. Students will be given an outline map of a region that we are studying and will have 1 week to fill in the state or country names and capitals. This will be an in-class assignment given 1-2 times per quarter.

Late and missing work:

Students who are not able to complete homework and class work on time will be assigned tutoring during break or lunch times. Large assignments including tests and quizzes can be made up, for an average of the 2 grades. Late work will be accepted until the quarter is over, but points will be deducted and work from a previous quarter will not be accepted without administrative approval. It is the responsibility of students who have excused absences to request make up work and complete it promptly. Unexcused absences are not entitled to make up missed work. PLAN AHEAD if you know you will be missing school! It is STRONGLY recommended that students who must miss class, or have any questions at all, use the classroom website and teacher email to keep up with the class.

Field Trips:

Field trips are an opportunity for students to learn outside of the classroom setting. There may be opportunities for students to participate in field trips this year. ALL students must have their field trip form signed by guardians and teachers in order to participate.

Teacher-Parent/Guardian Communication:

I highly encourage all parents/guardians to keep in good communication with me and Team Black Pearls teachers. You are welcome to schedule meetings with individual teachers or the whole team upon request to discuss your child's overall academic development or other matters. Students are responsible for maintaining a planner, and recording daily assignments is mandatory.

Behavioral Expectations: Think critically and be safe, respectful, and responsible!

In Social Studies, students will participate in writing, speaking, art, and kinesthetic activities with a positive attitude and should communicate appropriately with the teacher if they are not able to participate fully. Students are expected to come to class prepared, including prepared with high quality completed homework and projects.

We will follow all Team Black Pearls and School rules, and the consequences for infraction will be consistent across the team. Students may only bring in electronic devices with written permission from the teacher (for occasional research projects).
