| 100 | The ship building industry, fishing, and a little bit of piracy where the main economic activities in these colonies New England Colonies | The movement, both on purpose and by accident, of animals, plants, people, and diseases from the "old world" of Europe and Africa to the "New World" of the Americas The Columbian Exchange | This document, first signed in 1215, limited the power of the king, kept peace in England, and became the foundation of modern law and government. The Magna Carta | This country had early success conquering Central and South America, Spain | Industrialized nations like England wanted to control the production and sale of these things. Raw materials & manufactured goods | All teams have 1 minute to correctly label a map of the 13 colonies. 10 points per correct colony + bonus for first done (maximum 150 points) |
| 200 | These colonies were diverse, with settlers from many different countries Middle Colonies | The economic trade route that sent manufactured goods to Africa, enslaved people to the Americas, and raw materials to England and Europe The Triangle Trade | This document, signed in 1620, was an agreement made between passengers of a boat to form and follow their own laws. The Mayflower Compact | This country controlled most of North America before 1750. France | This began in England and then spread to Western Europe and America, making Britain powerful The Industrial Revolution | All teams have 1 minute to write a good definition of Mercantilism |
| 300 | These colonies had the highest enslaved population and used plantations to cash crops to sell to England Southern Colonies | This section of the Triangle Trade saw enslaved Africans loaded onto ships like animals and sent to the Americas where they would be auctioned off. The Middle Passage | This document, written in 1776, Thomas Paine argues that the colonies must become independent from Britain Common Sense | This group of people died in huge numbers when they met the Europeans. The survivors were enslaved and kicked off of their land. Native Americans | Daring the Industrial Revolution and French and Indian war, countries squeezed raw materials from their colonies | All teams have 1 minute to write a good description of the reasons for American slavery. |
| 400 | The earliest successful English colony in North America, it had a rough start facing disease, starvation, and raids by local native Americans Jamestown Colony | The economic theory that states that colonies should be established for the economic benefit of the mother country. Mercantilism | Before Magna Carta, this basic part of modern life was not an idea protected by law anywhere in the world. Human Rights/ Natural Rights | Finding this mythical water way between the Atlantic and Pacific was the goal of English, French, and Dutch explorers of North America. The North West Passage | A conflict between countries on 4 continents over many years, which is one of the causes of the American Revolution French & Indian War | All teams have 1 minute to correctly draw and label the triangle trade, including middle passage and goods shipped. (100 points/leg, 100 bonus for 1st done) |
| 500 | Fear of this in England caused Catholics, Quakers, Baptists, and many other kinds of Christian to settle in the Colonies seeking freedom. Religious Persecution | Sale of these agricultural products, which were not food, is what made the 13 colonies economically successful, especially the southern colonies. Cash Crops - cotton, tobacco | Before the Mayflower Compact, this basic part of modern government did not exist in America Self-government OR Voting | This event caused Spain to lose power and gave England the opportunity to begin forming colonies in North America Defeat of the Spanish Armada | This was not a party, but an act of theft and vandalism that showed colonists' anger over laws limiting trade. The Boston Tea Party | All teams have 1 minute to create a timeline of the causes of the American Revolution (100 points for each correct item) |
